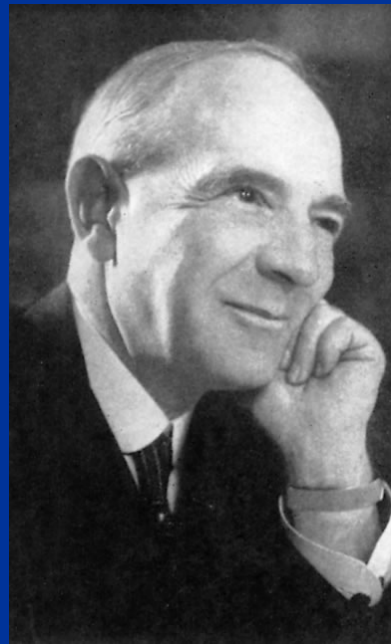

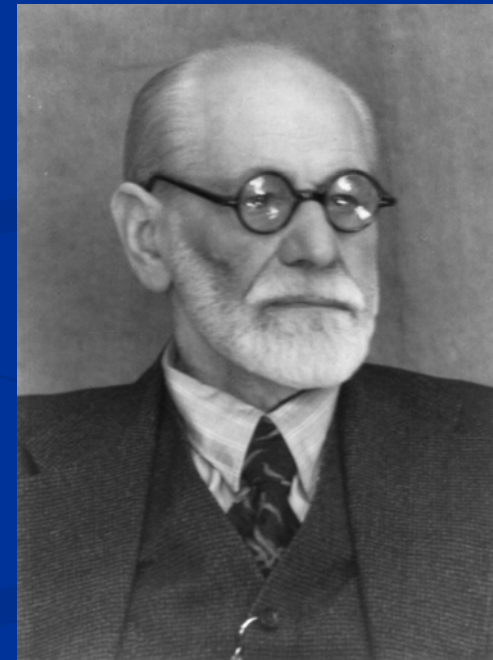
# 1925: The Great War Between NYPS and the IPA Begins

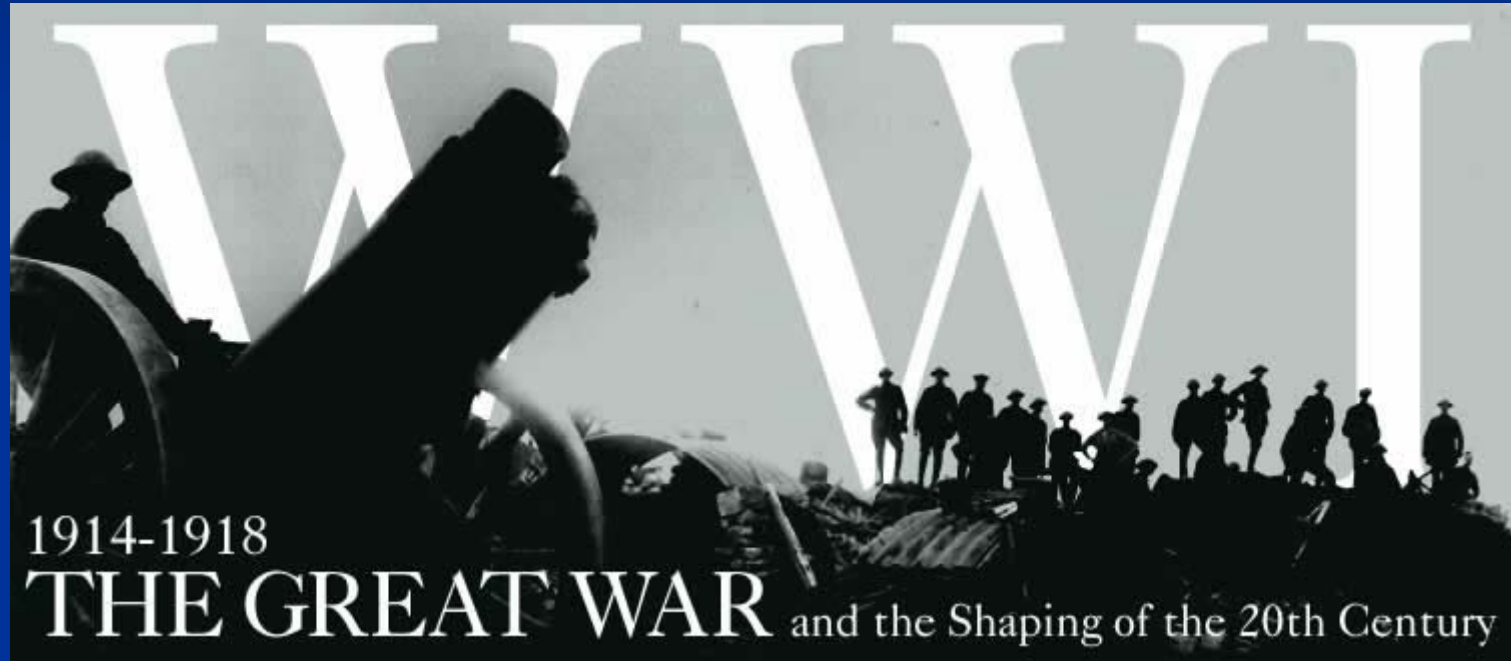

# 1918: Armistice Germany Surrenders



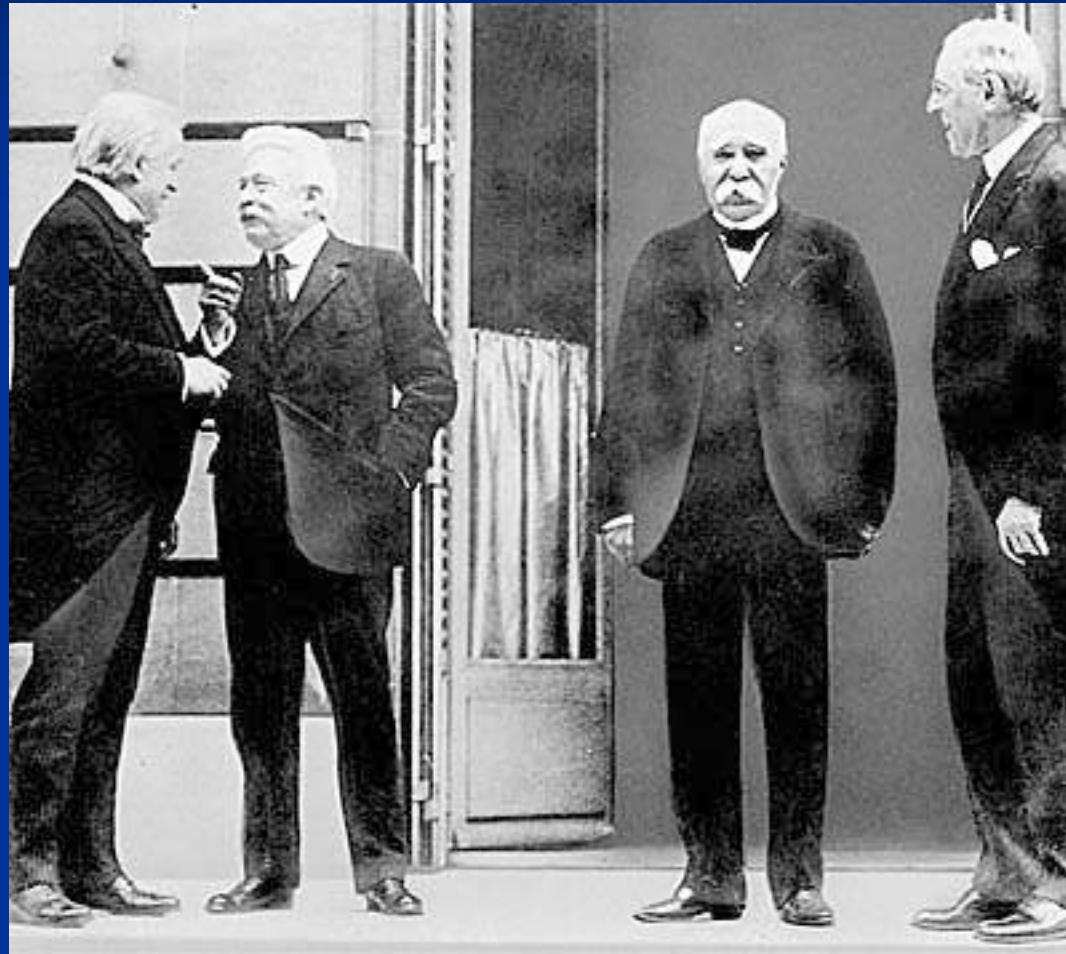
# 1938: End of Great War the IPA

## Surrenders:

APSA granted exclusive franchise for psychoanalysis in the United States

APsaA Institutes will only train physicians who have completed a psychiatric residency

# 1946: APsaA's Versailles

- 1) 1946: Reorganization of APsaA. Board of Professional Standards established which determines which members of which societies (certification) would qualify to become members of APsaA
- 2) Institute Graduates can become members of local societies but local membership would not automatically qualify them for membership in the Association

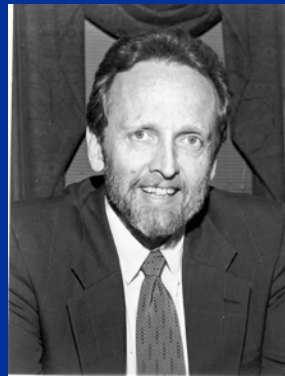

# 1987: The Division 39 Law Suit is Settled

Psychologists and social workers admitted to APsaA institute for training.

APsaA gives up exclusive American IPA franchise.

(1989: IPTAR, NYFS, & two west coast societies admitted to IPA)

1927: Theodore Reik accused of quackery by American patient. Defended by Freud “The Problem of Lay Analysis” Freud intervenes on Reik’s behalf and the charges are dropped.

1941: Karen Horney demoted TA to lecturer by New York Psychoanalytic Institute

Horney, Thompson, and three young analysts walk out of meeting

1941: Horney, Fromm, and Thompson found American Association for the Advancement of Psychoanalysis

1942: Rado and David Levy et al. found Association for psychoanalytic Medicine.

1944: Theodore Reik who had come of the United States in 1938 disconnects from the New York Psychoanalytic Society because he refuses to agree only to teach not to practice.

# APsaA's Long Road to Inclusion

1983: Extended Associate Dues Paying Non-voting member category established.

1989: Arlene Kramer Richards admitted to APsaA

1993: First delinkage passes second time. All graduates can become members but not vote for by laws run for office serve on BOPS or become TA

1996: Robert Galatzer Levy starts Bulletin Board (BBS)

1997: Paul Mosher starts the member's list and the open line

1999: Arlene Kramer Richards turned down by certification committee

1999: Arnold Richards starts the certification discussion on the APsaA internet list serves

2000: Arlene Richards passes certification

2001 Bylaw amendment granted full voting rights including right to vote on a bylaws amendments, and to serve as officers and Executive Council could be TA

2002: TFEM second delinkage passes -all members can vote for bylaws, run for office but not become TAs. Procedural Code rejected by BOD

2006: Local Option 57% yes.

Local Option (institutes can appoint non-certified members as training analysts)

2008: Two by law Amendments will be voted on in December. Institute Choice (local option) and Education flexibility (delinkage)
